Additional Champions League rules due to COVID

- If it is forbidden to enter a country or region that the clubs cannot affect, or if in a country are new conditions that only vaccinated or those who have get over COVID (2G) can play the game, then the game is postponed and the deadline for playing the game is 2 weeks before the next round of the Champions League, the clubs agree on a new date, and if they do not agree the date will be determined by NBC (the deadline for agreement on the date of the match is December 20, 2021). If the guest club could not be able to secure arrival that team loses the match 2: 0 in points, 8: 0 in team points and 24:0 in sets.
- Clubs are obliged to notify the postponement of the match by e-mail to the opposing team, the director of sport of NBC and the chief of referee **no later than 24 hours after receiving information about the conditions of the match.**
- If entry to the country is allowed with restrictions (EU COVID certificate, 3G), then there is a possibility to play the match and the match will not be postponed in that case.
- If a team is unable to play due to a COVID infection or because they do not have the EU COVID certificates required to play the match, that team loses the match 2: 0 in points, 8: 0 in team points and 24:0 in sets.
- For not playing the match there will be no sanctions that are according to the regulations
- The home team of the match will have to inform the guest team no later than Monday of the week when the match is played of the specific COVID conditions applicable in that country / region:
 - border crossing conditions,
 - bowling alley entering conditions,
 - whether masks are required and whether spectators are allowed,
 - additionally if there is some special features about COVID regulations
